**Introduction to the Course**

1. Welcome to the South Eastern Circuit Bar Mess Foundation Advanced International Advocacy Course. We are delighted that you will be participating in this course and we are sure that you will find it an inspiring and rewarding week.
2. The intention is to give you the chance to practise and hone your advocacy skills in a supportive and collegiate environment.
3. The course is intended to be intensive and challenging. Its aim is to stretch you as advocates, to give you the confidence to consolidate skills you have already acquired and to practise new skills. To this end, the course devotes a large amount of time in particular to training advocates in appellate advocacy and the handling of vulnerable witnesses and expert witnesses.
4. In addition good advocacy requires strong engagement with ethics and we have therefore included one ethics session and a talk on ethical issues.
5. The basic structure of the course is, wherever possible, to provide a Presentation and Demonstration of a particular form of advocacy before you are asked to perform it yourself.
6. Advocacy reviews are conducted using the Hampel Method of advocacy teaching with which most of you will be very familiar. For those of you used to the Hampel Method of advocacy teaching, you will notice that this course makes use of the revised method which detaches the “Replay” from the Review Session to a separate session conducted later, after time for reflection. This provides the Participant with an opportunity to adjust the performance to take account of what has been learnt during the earlier session. The Replay Sessions are clearly marked on the Schedule.
